

# SADIE 200 DAYS

Sadie arrived at Foothills Animal Rescue on Sept. 20, 2023, with her eight nursing puppies, just 2 ½ weeks old. Within days, Sadie and her pups were diagnosed with ringworm, requiring three months of treatment and quarantine. After 200 days in our care, Sadie was adopted on April 7, 2024, finding her perfect family on just her second adoption appointment.

#### **234 DAYS**

Tripp arrived on Jan. 9, and was diagnosed with ringworm, requiring weeks of treatment and monitoring offsite. Sweet and affectionate, he melted hearts with his purrs and gentle nature. After 234 days in our care, Tripp was adopted on Aug. 30.

### **HONEY**

#### **211 DAYS**

Honey arrived on May 17, and found a home after 50 days, only to be returned two weeks later. She evolved with care and a two week off-site training camp during her stay and was finally adopted into a loving home on Dec. 27.

### **THELMA & LOUISE**

#### **325 DAYS**

Thelma and Louise, a bonded pair born and raised in a warehouse, came to us on March 17, 2023. Their inseparable bond and unique needs required a special adopter with patience and understanding. After 325 days, these sweet sisters were adopted together on Feb. 2, 2024, finally finding a family to call their own.

### HENRY 145 DAYS

Henry arrived on Feb. 19, as a playful puppy with his brother, Peabody, and quickly charmed everyone with his boundless energy. He even became a campaign model, showcasing his sweet personality. After 145 days in our care, Henry found his forever family on July 13.

### POPPY 291 DAYS

Poppy, one of 27 cats transferred to us from Salome, AZ, on March 10, stayed with us for an incredible 291 days. Shy but hopeful, she waited patiently and was adopted just in time for the holidays on Dec. 26, finding a warm and loving forever home.

## PRINCESS LEIA 97 DAYS

After being adopted in 2019, Princess Leia returned to Foothills Animal Rescue on Feb. 6, after her beloved owner passed away. Placed in a foster home, her foster family couldn't let her go and officially adopted her on May 8. Leia's journey came full circle, giving her a second chance at love.

Mimi spent 309 days at Foothills Animal Rescue due to severe UTIs that required extensive treatment to save her kidney function. She arrived with symptoms that needed immediate care and left with a new lease on life. On Jan. 12, 2024, Mimi found her forever home, where she'll continue to thrive with a special diet.

SAMMY'S INCREDIBLE STORY

On Aug. 15, 2023, Sammy was transferred to Foothills Animal Rescue from a shelter partner. Upon intake, he tested positive for Giardia, which was immediately treated. Shortly after his arrival, staff and volunteers observed that Sammy was hearing impaired or completely deaf. Recognizing the unique challenges this posed for his adoption, Foothills Animal Rescue turned to the community for resources. A trainer generously stepped in, teaching staff and volunteers how to use hand signals and other tools to effectively communicate with Sammy and set him up for success.

Sammy's journey wasn't without additional hurdles. One day, he became ill, showing signs of an obstructive foreign body. An emergency hospital visit confirmed the need for an enterotomy to remove part of a rope toy from his digestive system. After a successful surgery and recovery, Sammy was placed back up for adoption.

Over his 362 days in our care, Sammy received hundreds of hours of training, enrichment, and walks, thanks to the dedication of staff and volunteers. On July 14, 2024, he was adopted for the first time. Unfortunately, unforeseen housing matters led to Sammy's return. But Sammy's resilience and the

Sammy's story is a testament to the compassion and commitment of those who cared for him and believed in his potential. Through patience, perseverance and teamwork, Sammy overcame countless obstacles and now enjoys the loving home he truly deserves.

When Esperanza arrived at Foothills Animal Rescue on Sept. 9, her tiny, two-pound frame and unsteady walk immediately tugged at our hearts. She appeared to have a neurological issue as she struggled with stability and had an atrophied left eye, leaving us concerned about her future. Despite her challenges, this sweet kitten only wanted one thing: to be held and loved.

After consulting with Dr. Brett at Arizona Animal Hospital, Esperanza was diagnosed with Microphthalmia in her left eye and medial strabismus (cross-eye) in her right eye. Thankfully, her vision impairment did not affect her neurological health, and Dr. Brett deemed her physical condition good overall.

By late October, Esperanza's left eye began causing significant discomfort due to swelling and exposed conjunctival tissue. The decision was made to proceed with enucleation surgery to relieve her pain and improve her quality of life.

After surgery, Esperanza recovered in a foster home, where she gained weight, healed from her procedure and blossomed into a playful, affectionate companion. Through every step of her journey, from evaluations to surgery and recovery, we were committed to giving Esperanza the care she needed to thrive. On Nov. 13, she found her forever home. Esperanza's story reminds us that every life is worth saving.

Together we raised an incredible **\$80,788** to support our mission.




